General Requirements for Marriage in the Catholic Church

- A Catholic can be married in a Catholic church other than their own parish church only with the permission of the bride's pastor or parochial administrator. A marriage between a Catholic and someone of a different faith tradition requires the permission of the pastor or the parochial administrator.
- In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, Catholic weddings must take place in a Catholic church.
- A Catholic may be married in a non-Catholic church if special permission or dispensation is obtained from the Archbishop. A priest or deacon may participate in such a ceremony once permission is obtained. In such circumstances, the couple is still required to receive prenuptial preparation.
- It is possible to include a non-Catholic minister in the wedding ceremony at Holy Family Church.
- Any Catholic priest or deacon the couple wishes to witness their wedding is welcome at Holy Family. Normally, the officiating priest or deacon will be responsible for prenuptial preparation. Please inform the priest or deacon at Holy Family if you wish to have another priest celebrate your wedding liturgy.
- Baptismal records of both bride and groom must be presented.
- If either bride or groom was previously married, documentation verifying freedom to marry in the Catholic Church must be provided.
- Special circumstances such as a couple living within a civil marriage, a couple cohabitating or a couple who is experiencing a pregnancy may require further additional guidance.
